


What is the "Buckeye Key?" -a Service Tool


Providing Resources

CHICAGO 2018 - Have you Bean?


International Convention is an amazing opportunity for members from all branches of the K-family to meet under a united banner of service, leadership, and education. This year, International Convention was held in Chicago, Illinois, where attendees saw many memorable sights and attractions!

Members of the House of Delegates voted on measures such as eliminating the dual nomination practice and electing the International Board for the 2018-2019 service year. Initially, the floor opened with a proposition to stop the practice of dually nominating the runner-up candidates for the offices of President and Vice President. This allowed the runner-up candidates to be placed on the ballot for the office of International Trustee as well. Debate intensified over the course of The House of Delegates where elections were also underway.

In the end, voting members decided to keep the practice of dual nomination, while also electing Emily Rice from the Minnesota-Dakotas District as International President and Hannah Nivar (Ohio's Immediate Past International Trustee) from New Jersey as International Vice President. In addition, eleven new International Trustees were elected to serve on the I-Board for the 2018-2019 service year!




